



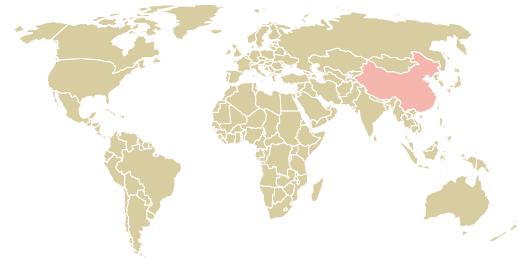
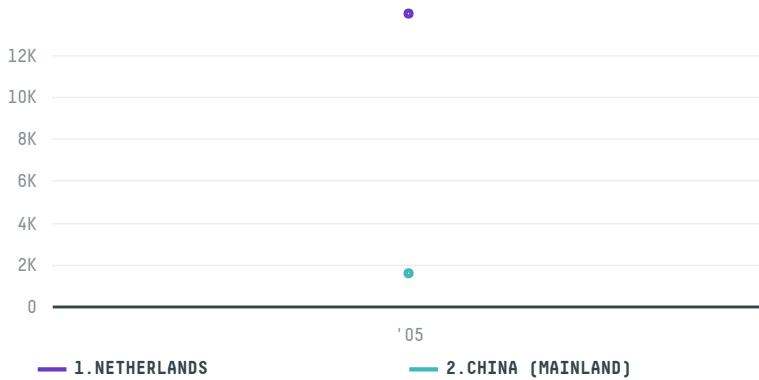

BENA TRADING was the 58th largest importer of soy from BRAZIL in 2005, accounting for 16 thousand tons. As an importer, BENA TRADING sources from 1 municipalities, or 0% of the soy production municipalities. The main destination of the soy imported by BENA TRADING is NETHERLANDS, accounting for 90% of the total.
