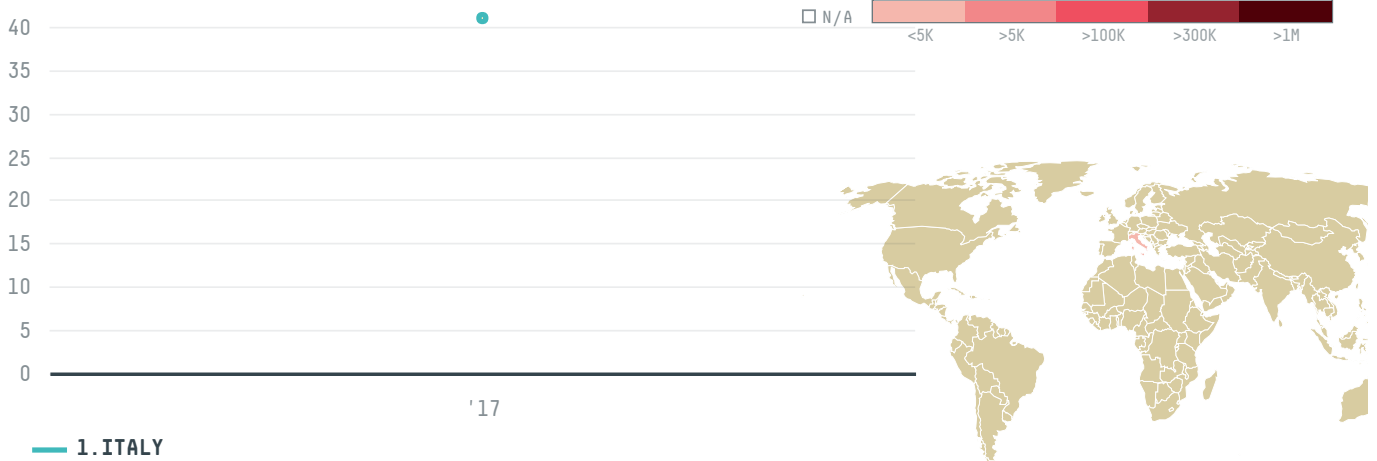

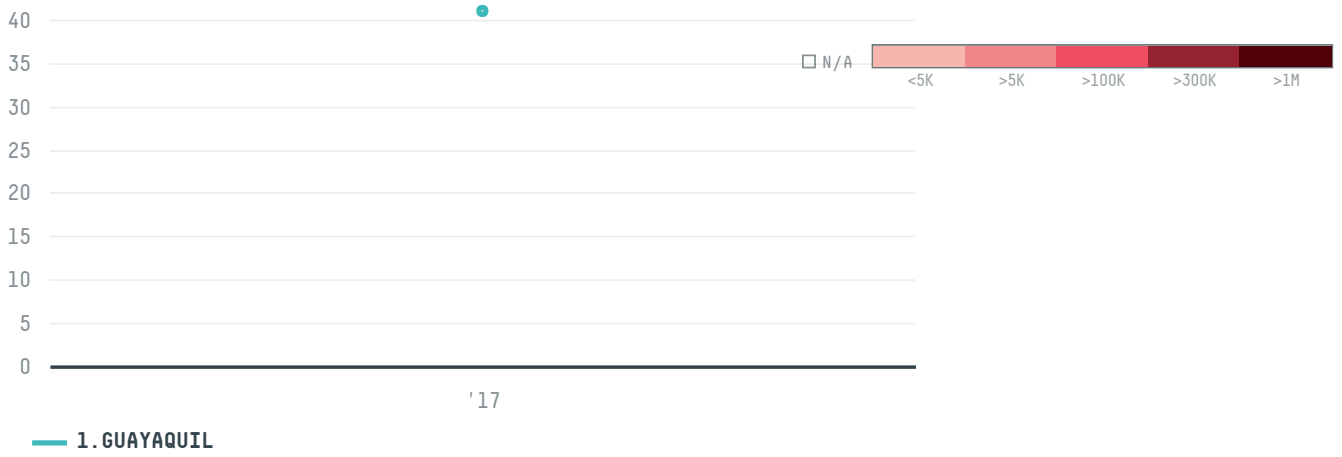

The main destination of the shrimp imported by BLUE MARLIN AND SEAFOOD C A is ITALY, accounting for 100% of the total.
