



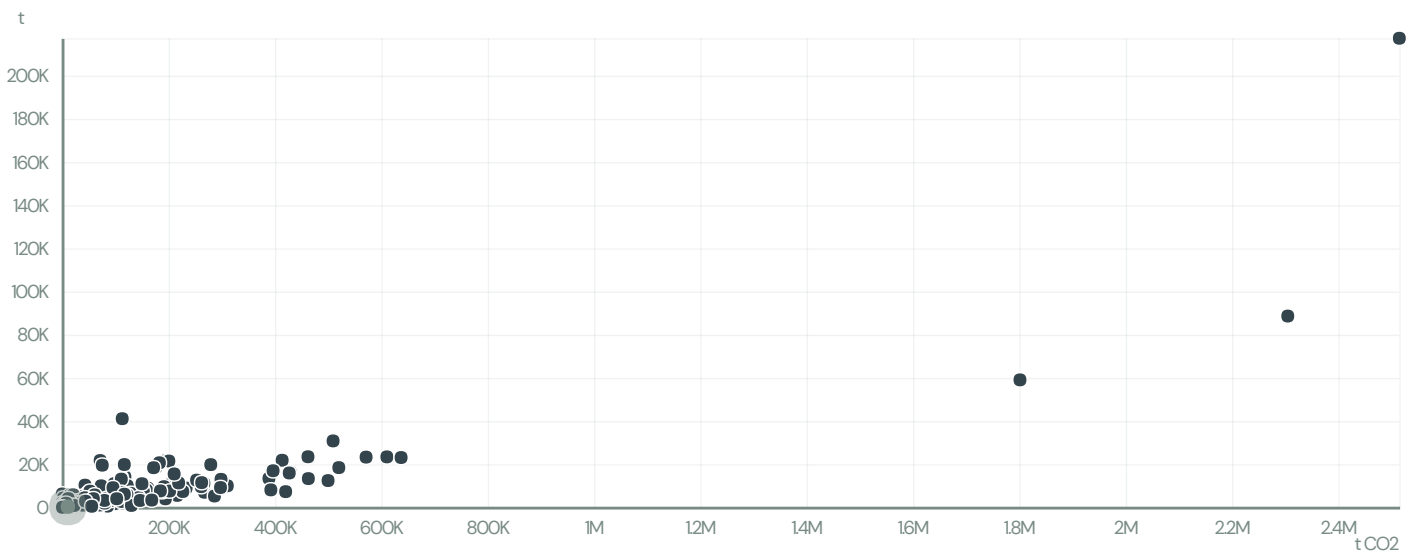
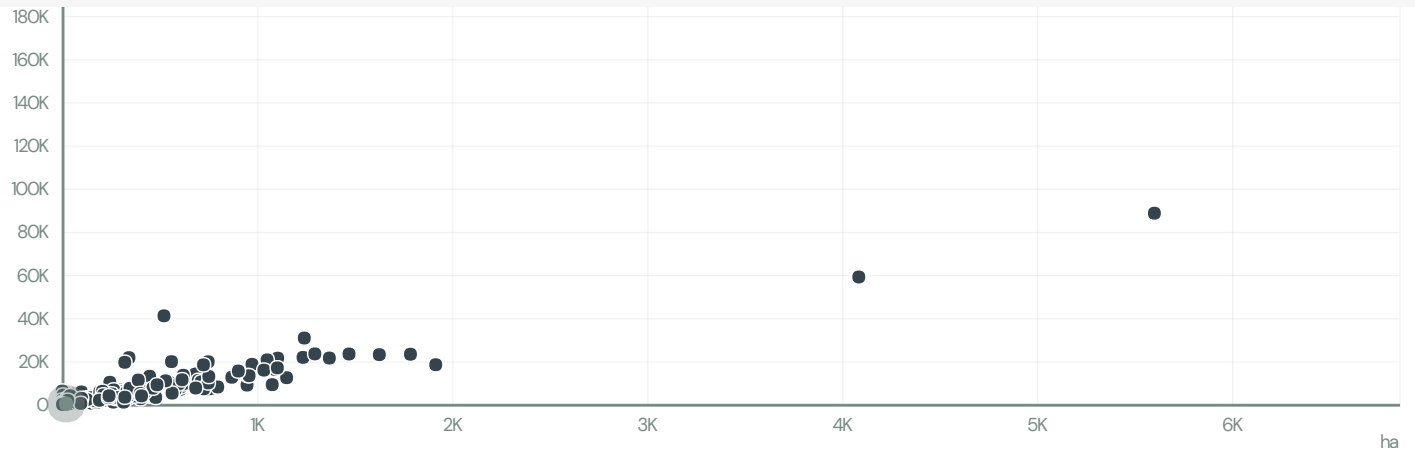
# HENG SHENG FOODS

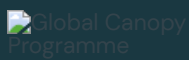
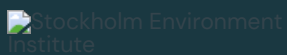
HENG SHENG FOODS was the 604th largest importer of beef from BRAZIL in 2017, accounting for 346 tons. This is a 38% decrease vs the previous year. As an importer, HENG SHENG FOODS sources from 240 municipalities, or 8% of the beef production municipalities.
