DAH CHONG HONG was the 23rd largest importer of pork from BRAZIL in 2018, accounting for 1 thousand tons. This is a 79% decrease vs the previous year. As an importer, DAH CHONG HONG sources from 22 municipalities, or 6% of the pork production municipalities. The main destination of the pork imported by DAH CHONG HONG is CHINA (HONG KONG), accounting for 100% of the total.

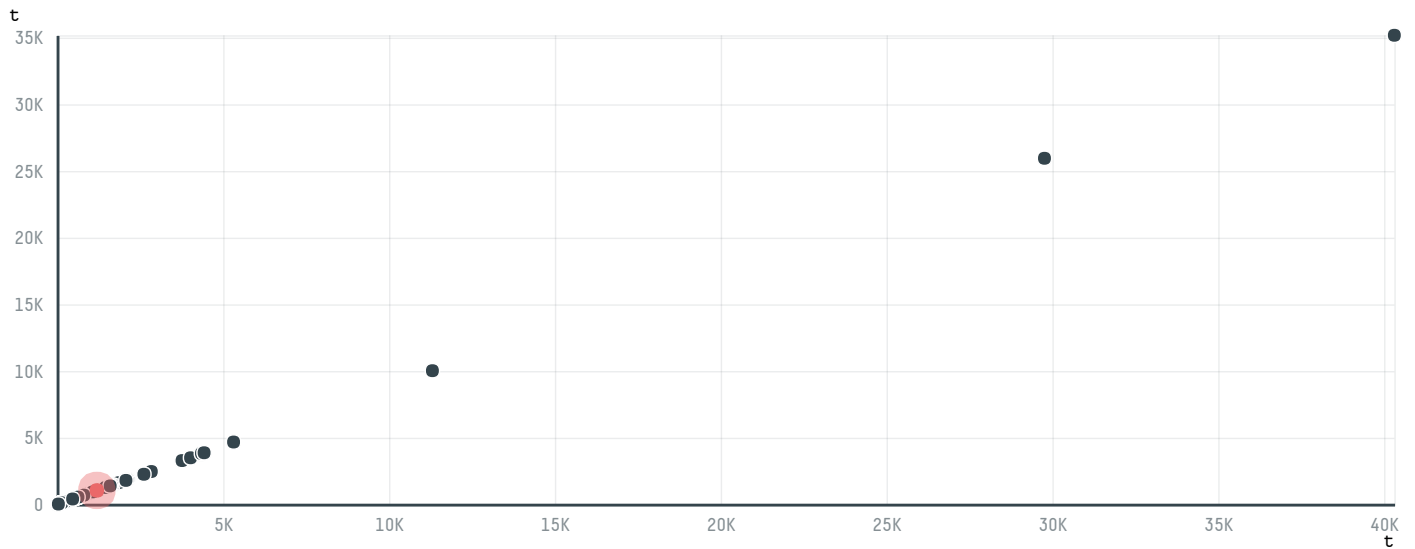

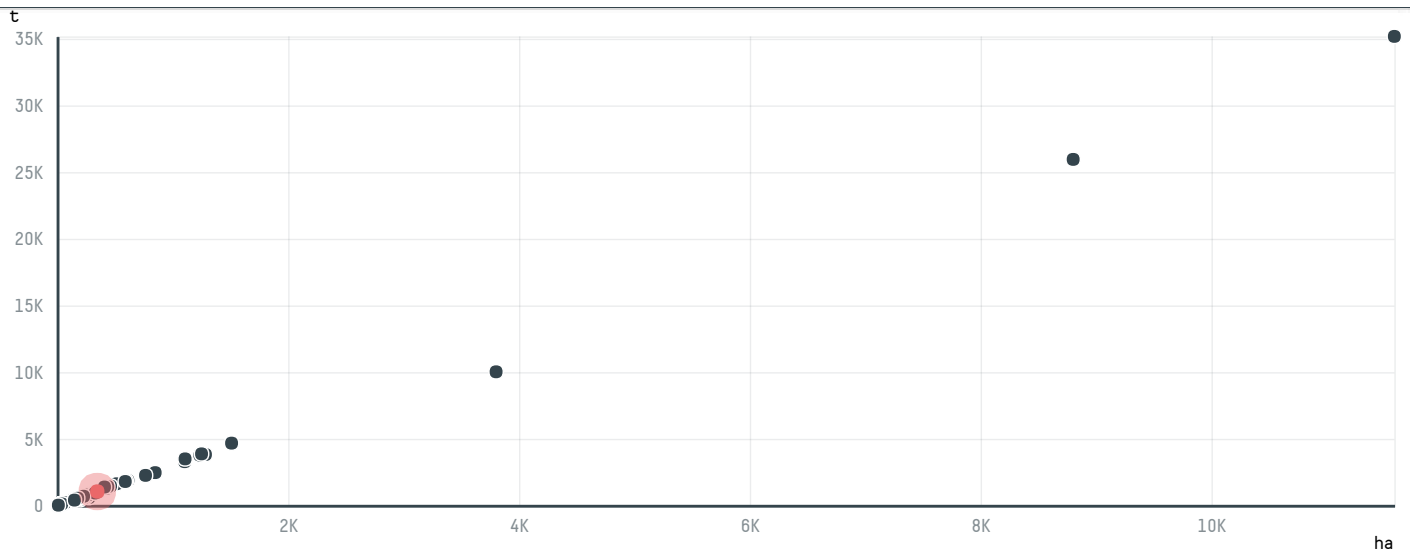
