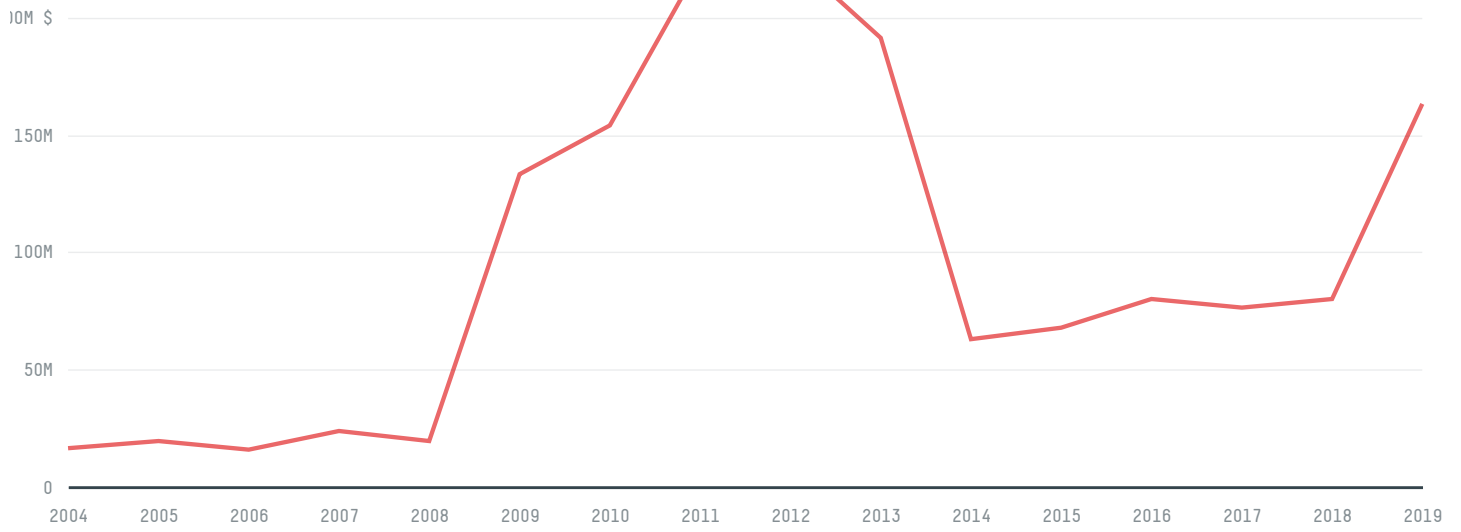

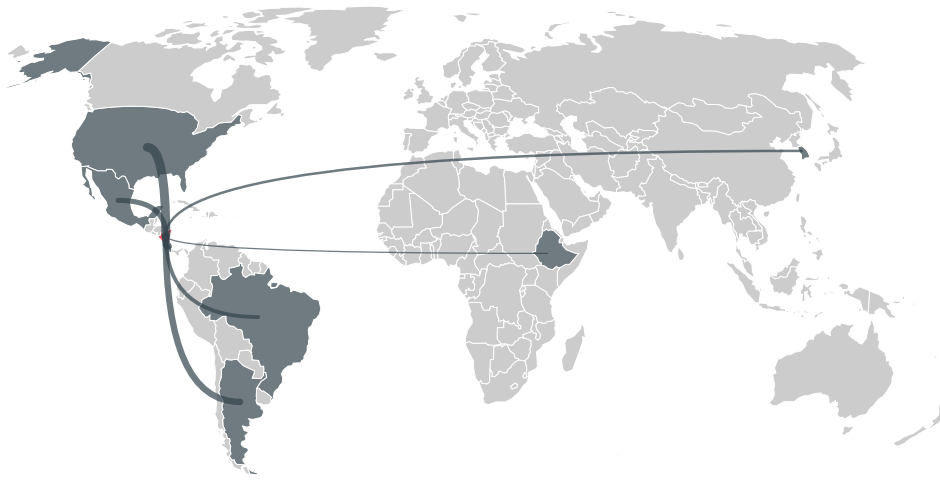
## IMPORT TRAJECTORY OF NICARAGUA
