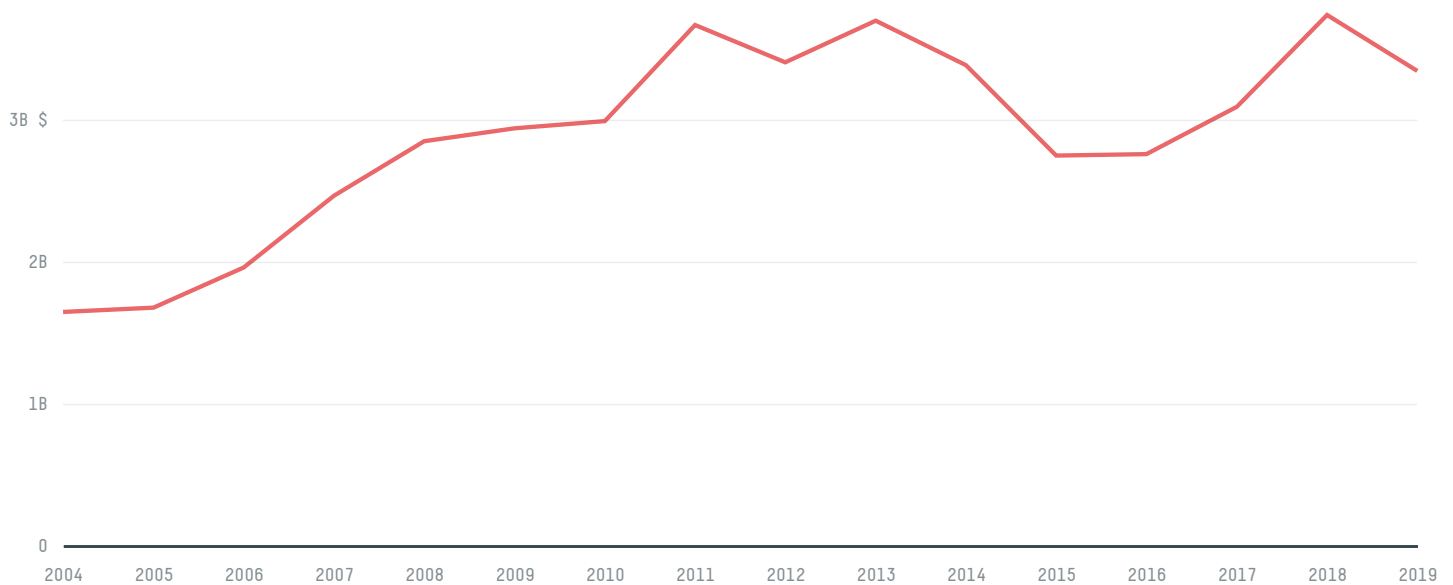

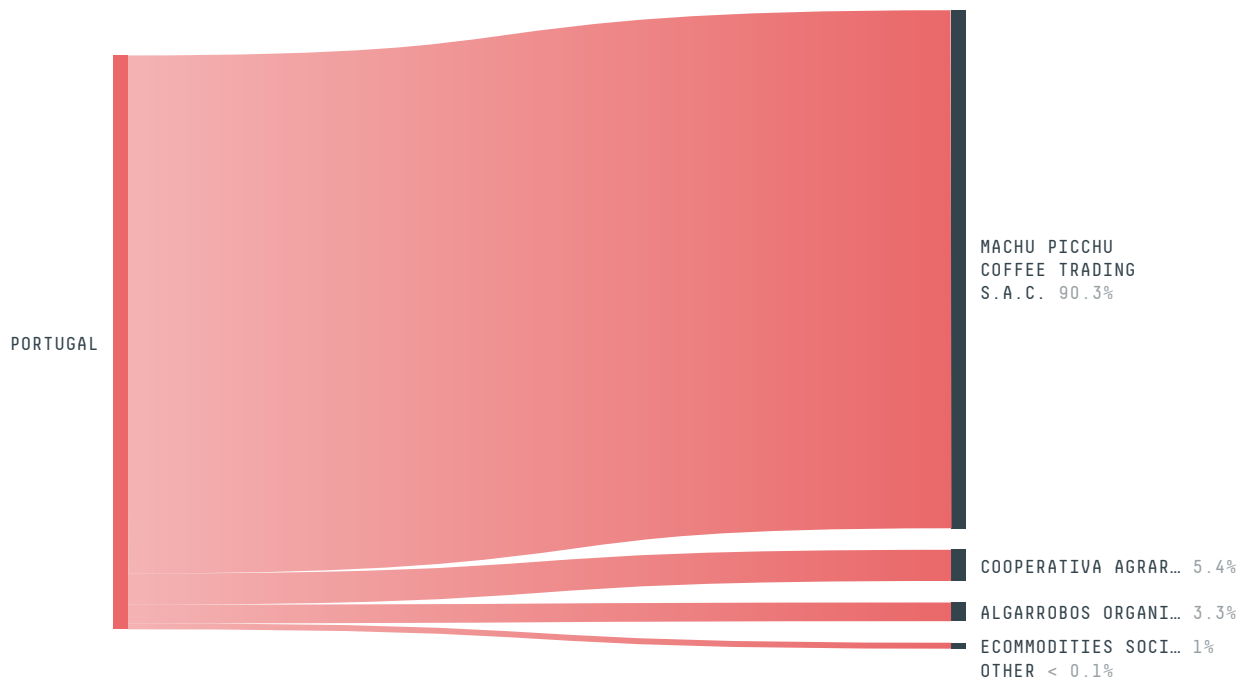

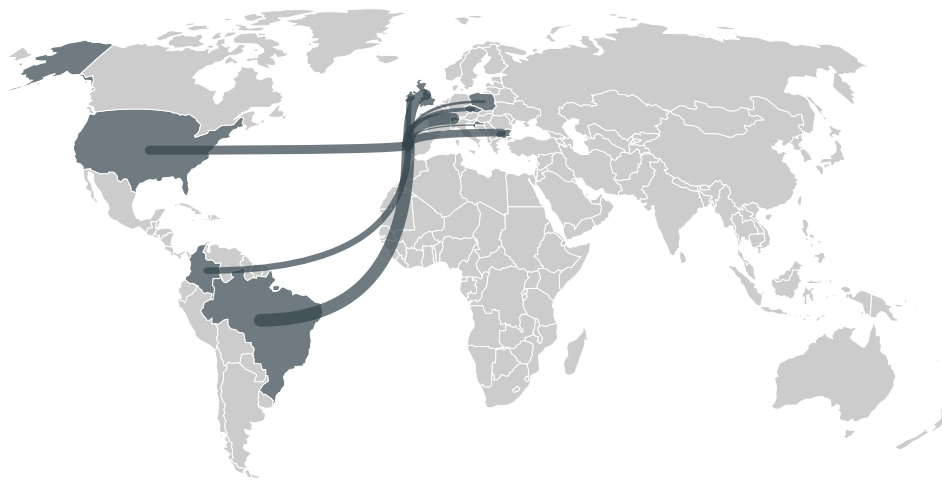
## IMPORT TRAJECTORY OF PORTUGAL
