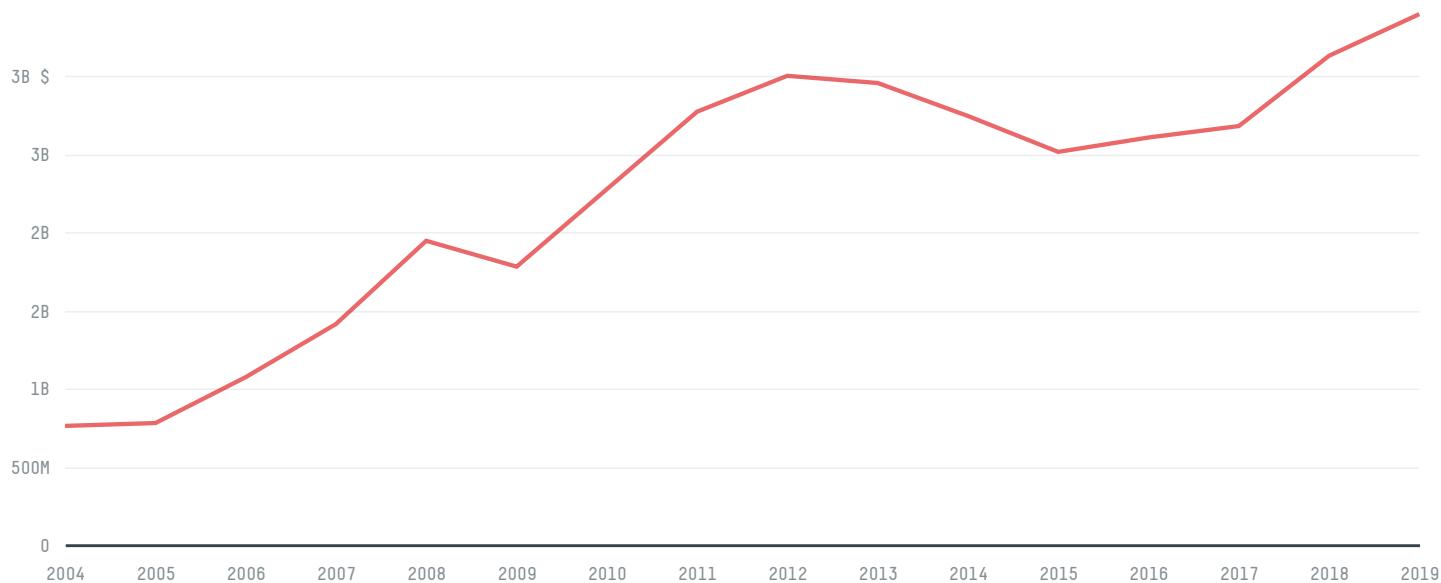

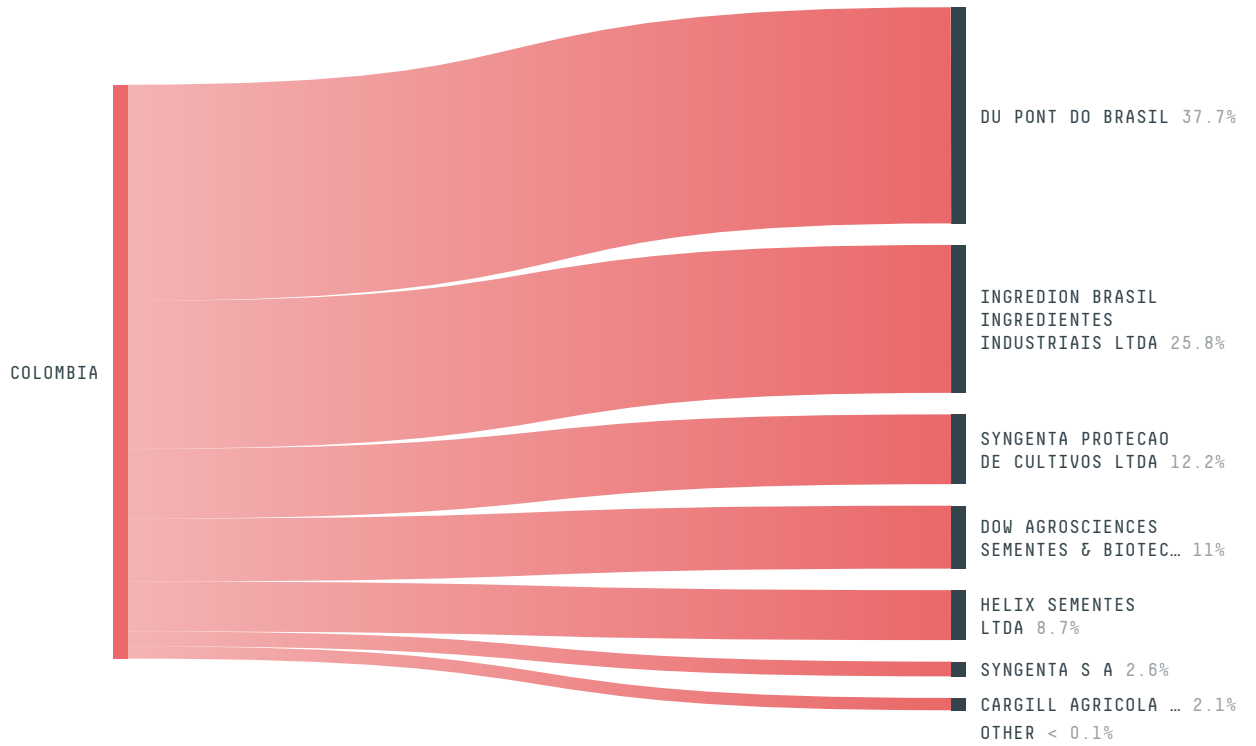

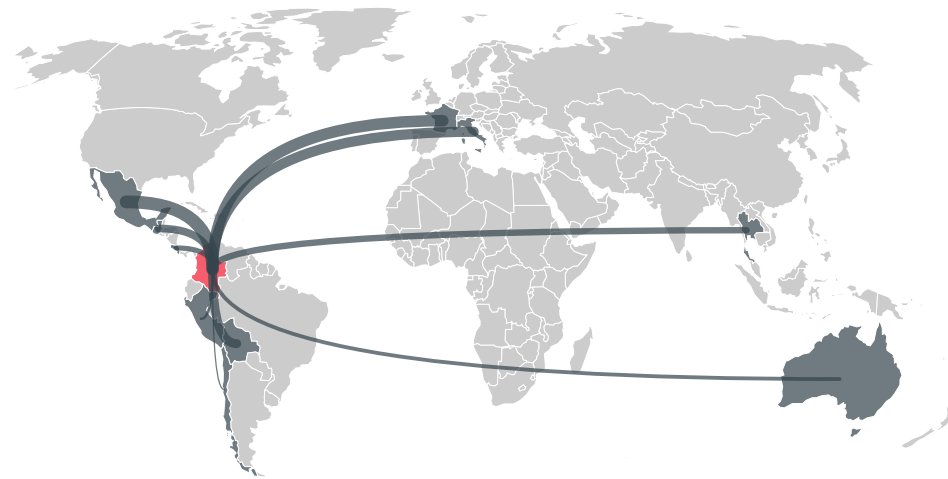
IMPORT TRAJECTORY OF COLOMBIA



TOP EXPORT TRADERS OF CORN IN COLOMBIA IN 2017



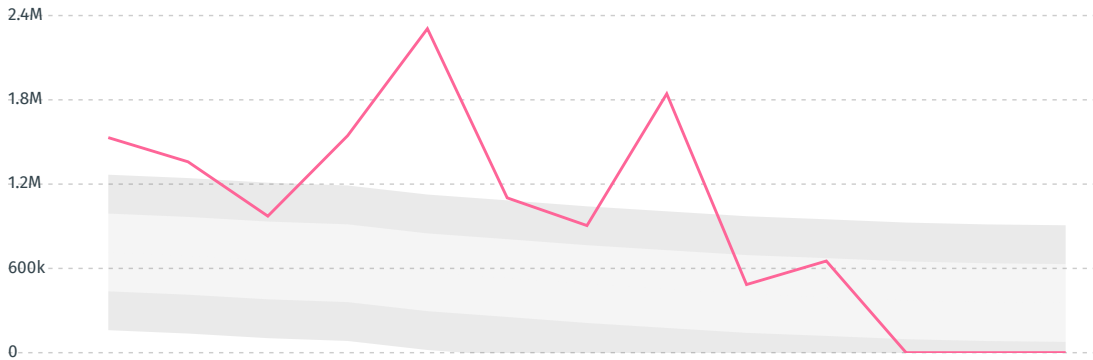

There were **506** GLAD alerts reported in the week of the **18th of January 2021**. This was **low** compared to the same week in previous years.

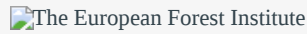
