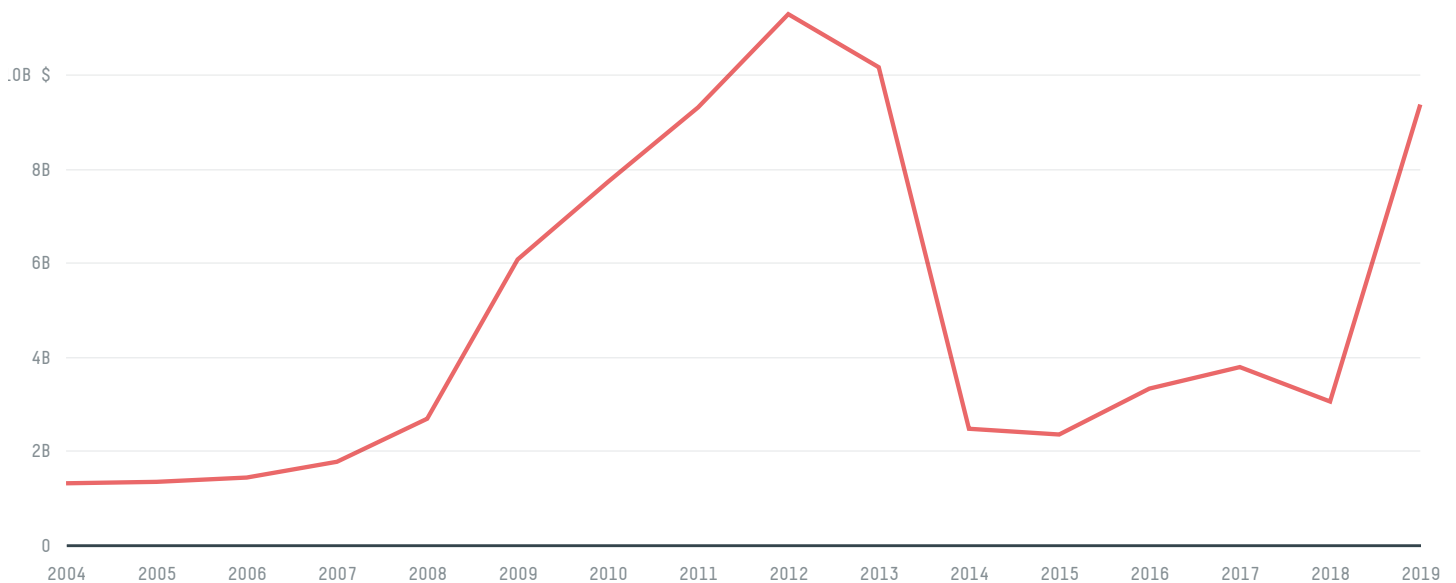

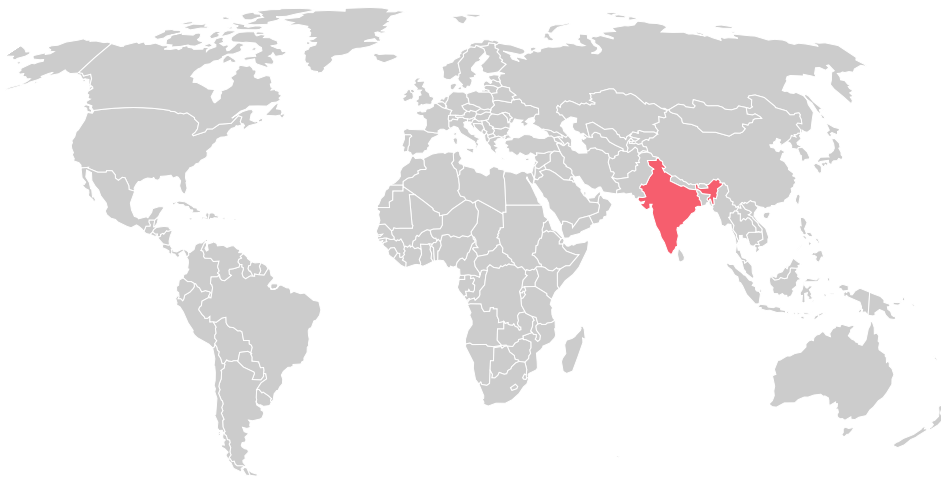
## IMPORT TRAJECTORY OF INDIA



## TOP EXPORT TRADERS OF PALM KERNEL IN INDIA IN 2017

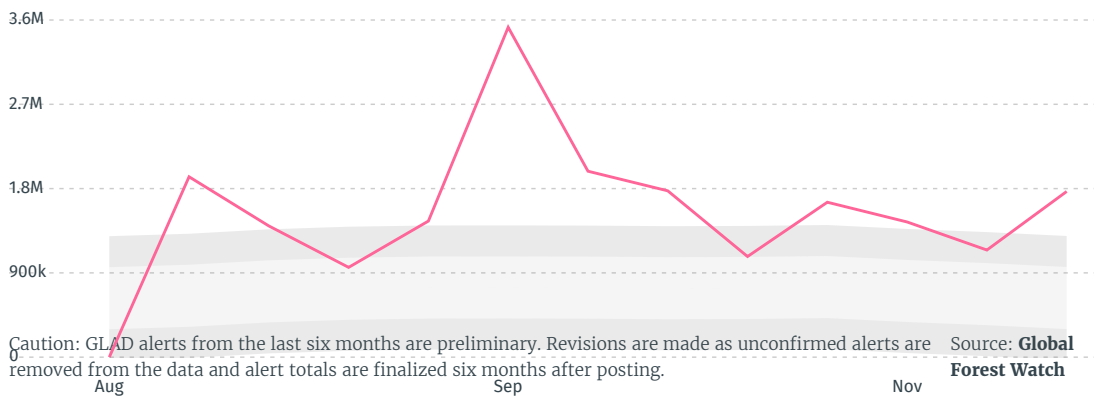


## TOP EXPORT COUNTRIES OF PALM KERNEL TO INDIA IN 2017
