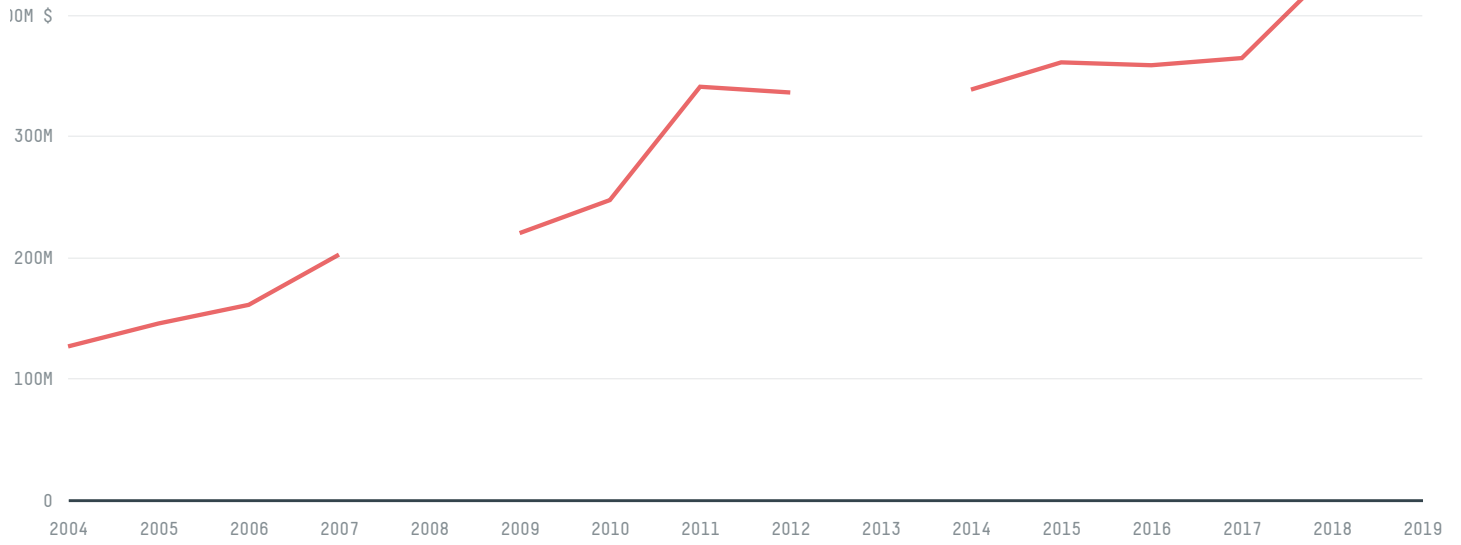

TOP EXPORT TRADERS OF WOOD PULP IN HONDURAS IN 2015



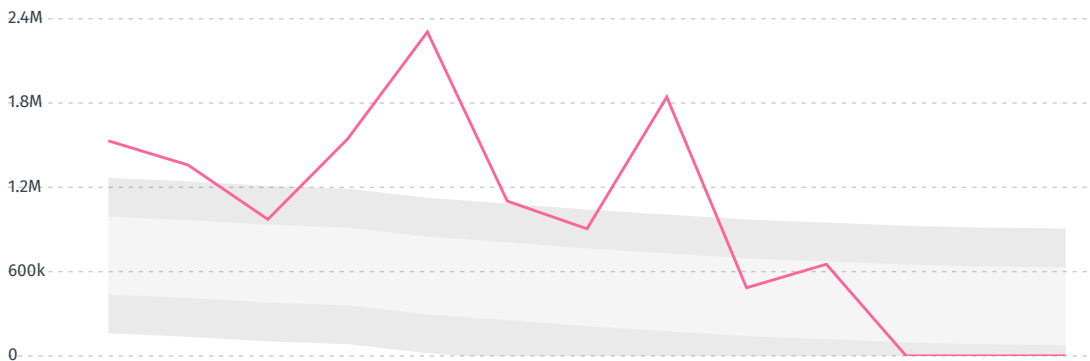
TOP EXPORT COUNTRIES OF WOOD PULP TO HONDURAS IN 2015
