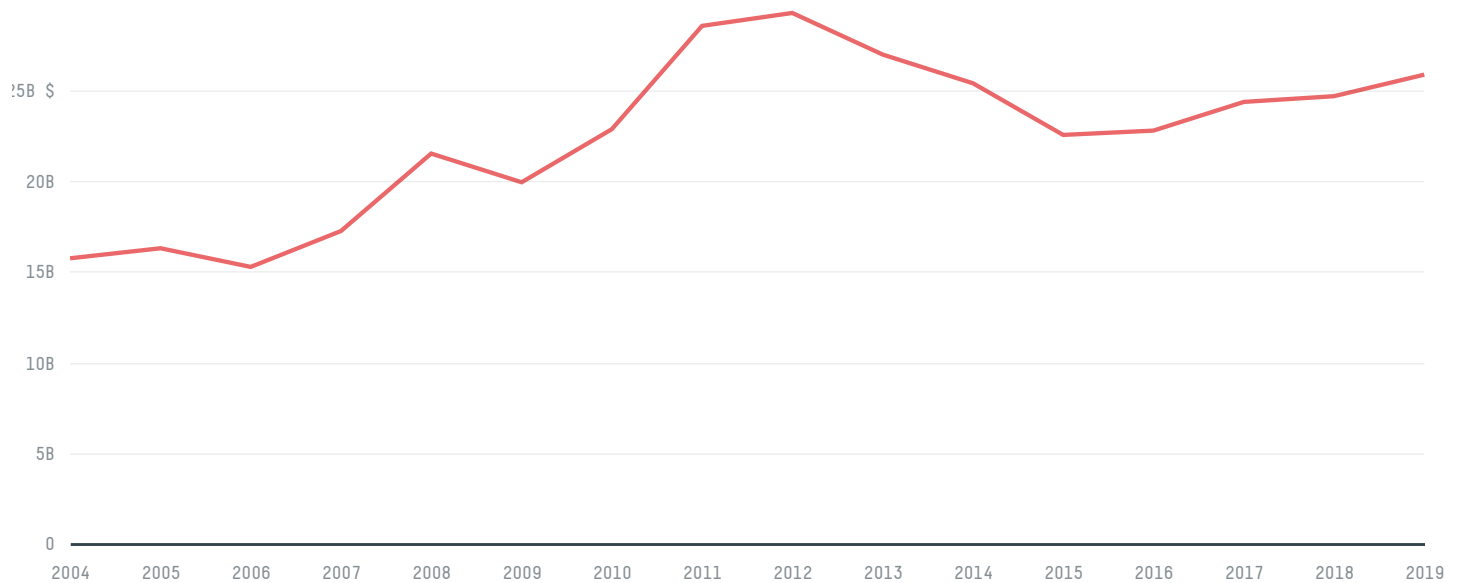

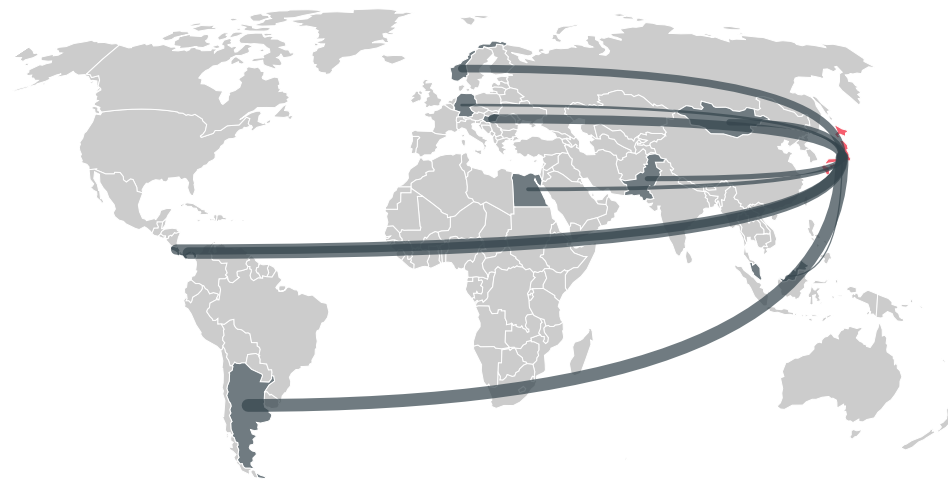
IMPORT TRAJECTORY OF JAPAN

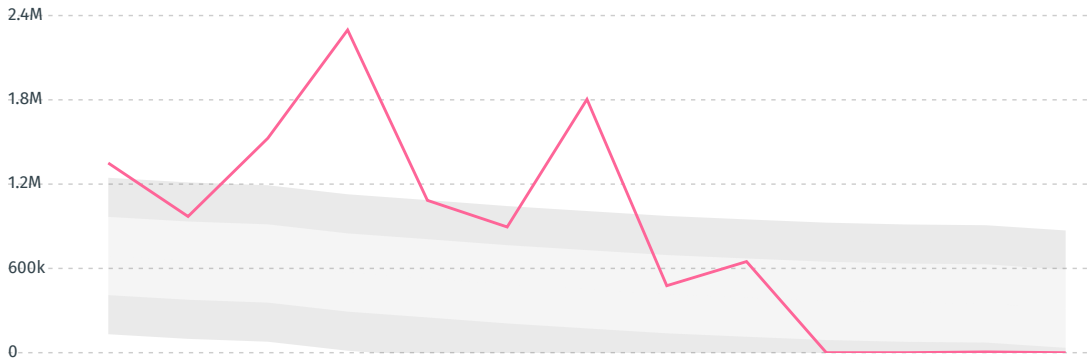
