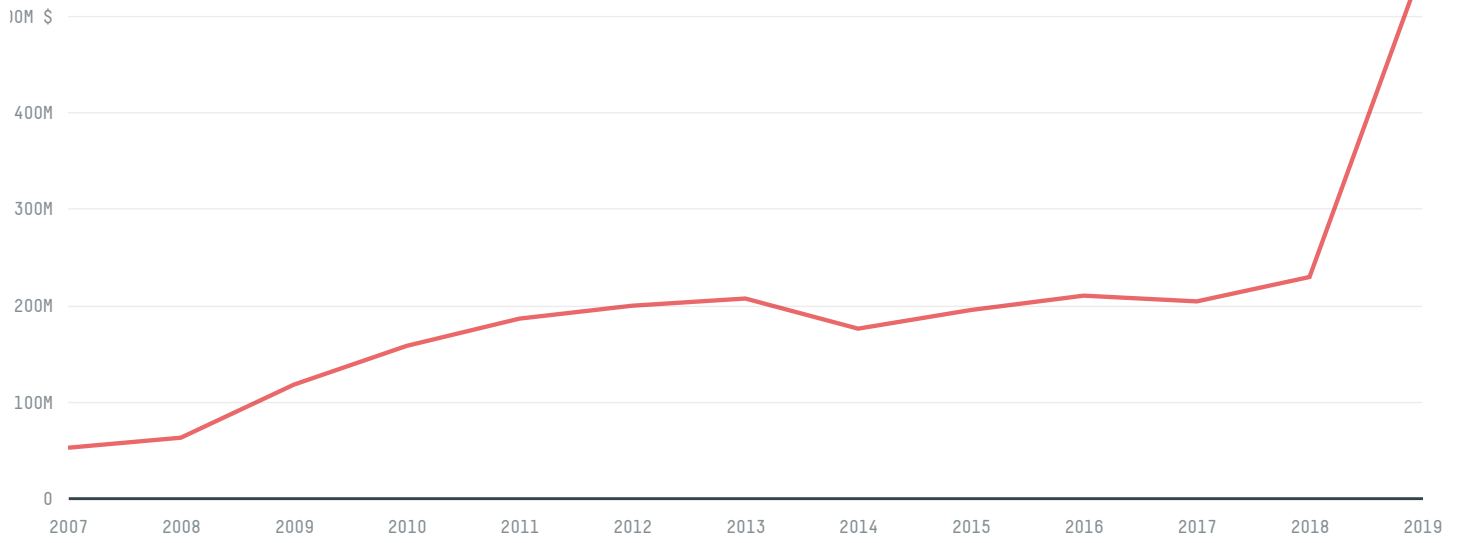

TOP EXPORT TRADERS OF PORK IN OCCUPIED PALESTINIAN TERRITORY IN 2018



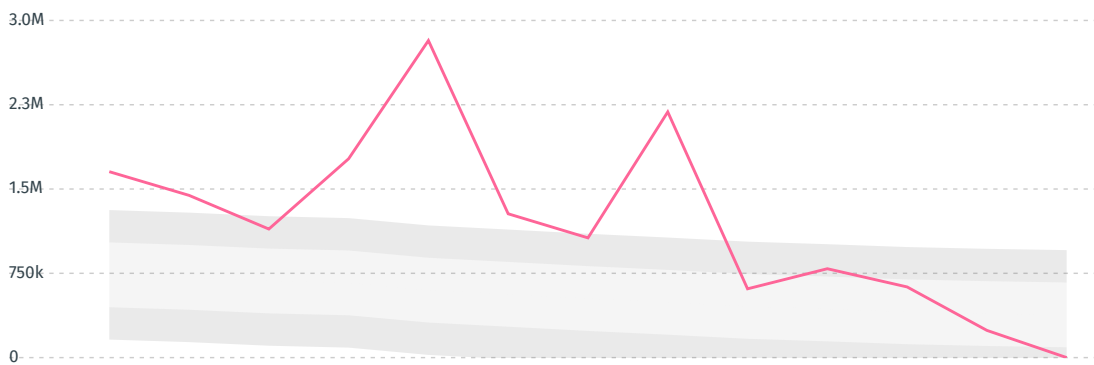
TOP EXPORT COUNTRIES OF PORK TO OCCUPIED PALESTINIAN TERRITORY IN 2018
